



A common symbol for Thanksgiving is a **CORNUCOPIA** - a curly, cone shaped basket overflowing with flowers, fruit and corn.

A cornucopia is used for Thanksgiving because it represents an abundant supply of good things. As we think about good things like families, friends and having what we need, we are thankful.

The cornucopia was first used in Greek and Roman mythology. The cornucopia was a twisty, hollow goat's horn that was filled with something to feed and care for a character that needed help in the myth. The image of the cone shaped horn full of good things is now a symbol or icon of having what we need and sharing it together.
